Visiting Volunteers

The volunteers at the Crossroads Inlet Centre Hospice (Port Moody) and those who serve the residents of New Westminster are recognised by their unique sense of caring and compassion. Visiting volunteers also take that compassion into the homes and hospitals in the communities Crossroads serves. Some of the many roles they take part in include:

- One-to-one support
- Sitting vigil support
- Meal companions
- Caregiver support
- Visits with patients

Visiting volunteers must complete a comprehensive training program that includes topics such as:

- What to say to a dying person
- Palliative care and hospice concepts
- Needs of the terminally ill and their families
- Coping with loss, bereavement and grief
- Listening and communication skills

Training sessions are available in both New Westminster and in the Tri-Cities.

Art Cart Program

The Art Cart volunteers work with patients and guests to engage in creative experiences that offer respite during the trying times faced during the end-of-life. Volunteers help patients create projects such as memory albums, picture collages and hand-made cards as memories for their loved ones.

Tea Service

The Tea Service at Crossroads Inlet Centre Hospice, is hosted by two volunteers every Tuesday, Friday and Sunday afternoon. Volunteers bring freshly baked goods and prepare a complete coffee and tea service offering a little bit of respect and refinement in lives of others.

Gardening

Crossroads Inlet Centre Hospice offers gardeners the chance to maintain peaceful patio gardens.
